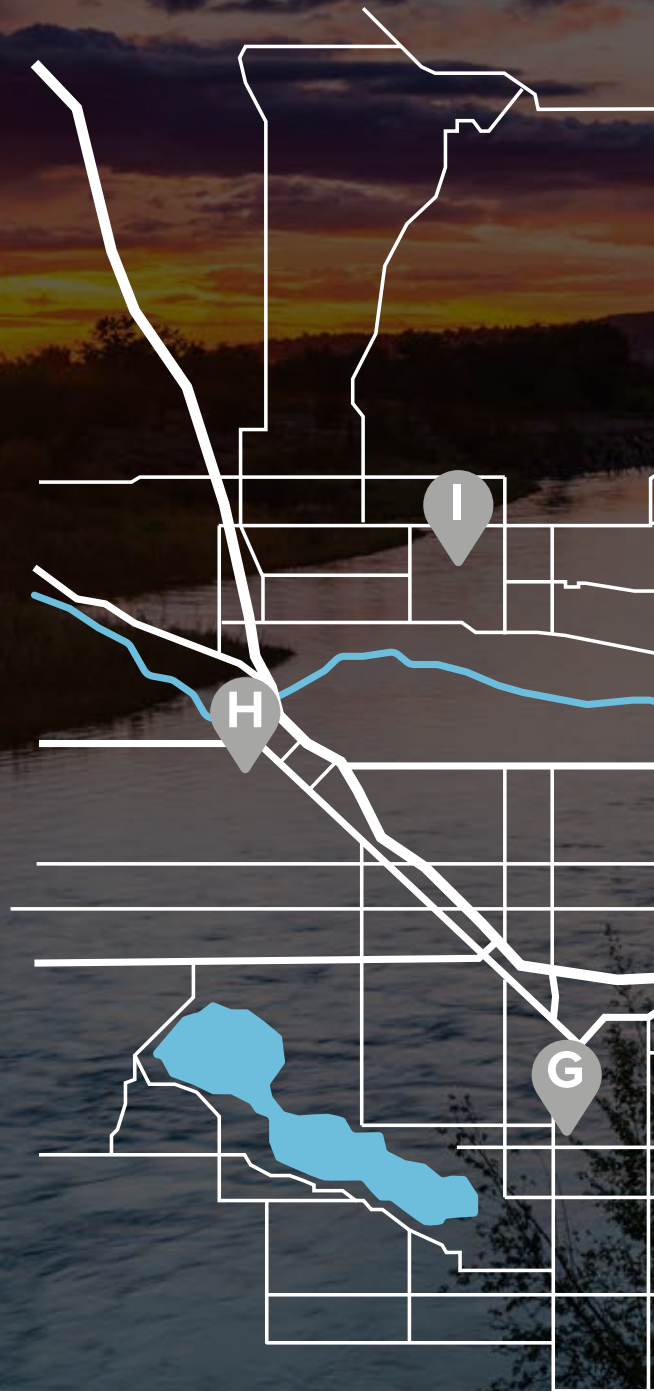

GETTING HERE & GETTING AROUND



From daily commutes to weekend escapes, here's how to navigate life in the Treasure Valley.

AIR TRAVEL

Boise Airport (BOI) is served by seven major airlines (including Alaska, Delta, Southwest, United, American, Frontier, and Allegiant) offering nonstop flights to 26 destinations and easy one stop connections to more than 350 cities worldwide.

QUICK FACTS:

10 minute drive from downtown Boise

New terminal expansion opening soon

Nearby regional airports in McCall, Sun Valley, and Twin Falls make mountain getaways quick and convenient

AVERAGE COMMUTE TIMES:

Boise → Meridian: 15–20 min

Boise → Eagle: 20–25 min

Nampa → Boise: 30–35 min

Caldwell → Boise: 35–40 min

Kuna → Meridian: 10–15 min

Tip: Peak traffic runs 7:30–9:00 a.m. and 4:30–6:00 p.m., but major highways flow smoothly outside those times.



GETTING AROUND TOWN

Whether you're heading downtown or exploring the foothills, travel here is refreshingly easy.

PUBLIC TRANSIT:

Valley Regional Transit (VRT) serves much of Ada and Canyon Counties with local bus routes, commuter lines, and paratransit services.

CYCLING & WALKING:

The Boise River Greenbelt spans more than 25 miles through Boise, Garden City, and Eagle — linking parks and neighborhoods along a beautiful riverside route.

FREEWAYS:

I-84 connects east to west, Highway 55 leads to mountain towns like McCall and Cascade, while Highway 21 winds through Lucky Peak toward Idaho City and the Sawtooth Mountains.

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS:

Uber and Lyft are widely available, with bike and scooter shares in downtown Boise, and rental cars easily picked up at the Boise Airport.

NEW RESIDENT ESSENTIALS

DRIVER'S LICENSE & VEHICLE REGISTRATION:

Complete both within 30 days of establishing Idaho residency. Visit your county DMV office or schedule an appointment online for faster service.

HOMEOWNER'S EXEMPTION:

Did you know Idaho offers a \$125,000 exemption on the taxable assessed value of your primary residence? Apply through your county assessor's office once your home is owner occupied.

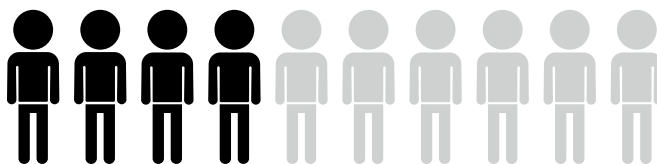

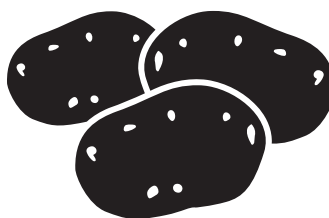

Boise, Idaho, is known for its sunny climate. On average, Boise enjoys about 206 sunny days per year. The city's semi-arid continental climate brings four distinct seasons: warm to hot summers, cold winters, and mild springs and falls—all with low humidity that makes temperature extremes more comfortable.

A COMFORTABLE CLIMATE

One of the key features of Boise's climate is the low humidity, which makes temperature extremes more tolerable. In the summer, the dry heat is less oppressive than in more humid regions, and in the winter, the cold is a dry chill rather than a damp one. Precipitation in Boise and the Treasure Valley is relatively low, with most rain falling in spring and light snow in winter. The area's dry, sunny climate supports outdoor activity year round—from skiing and snowboarding in winter to hiking, biking, and water sports in summer.

LIFE IN EVERY SEASON

Boise's weather also brings plenty of variety throughout the year. Residents enjoy crisp fall colors, bright winter days, and a long stretch of pleasant spring sunshine. Changing conditions rarely disrupt daily life, allowing locals to stay active outdoors and appreciate Idaho's natural beauty in every season.

THE NUTCRACKER

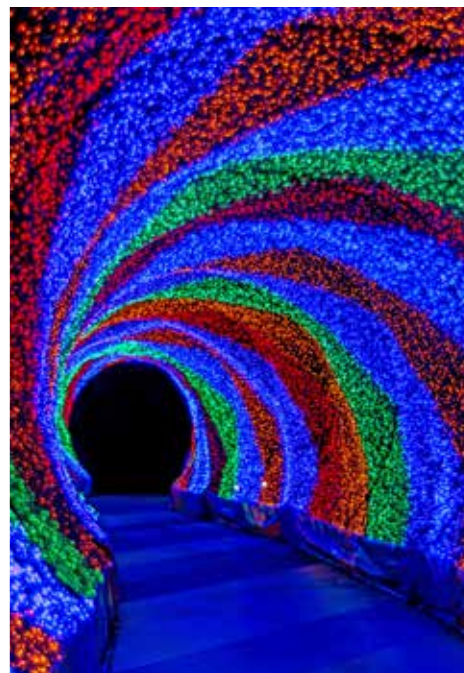

Long summer days are best spent near the water, where calm lakes and rushing rivers offer both relaxation and excitement. From paddleboarding and swimming to rafting and boating, these local favorites promise endless ways to cool off and unwind.

FLOATING THE BOISE RIVER

A classic summer tradition, the Boise River float offers a relaxing journey through the heart of the city. The six mile stretch from Barber Park to Ann Morrison Park takes about two to three hours, with gentle currents, shaded banks, and plenty of spots to stop and enjoy the view. Raft and tube rentals, along with shuttle service, make planning easy. Life jackets are required for anyone under 14 and recommended for all.

LAKE LOWELL

Located near Nampa, Lake Lowell is surrounded by wildlife refuges and open space, offering a peaceful escape for boating, fishing, and kayaking. Its calm waters and natural scenery make it a favorite for birdwatching and quiet picnics by the shore.

LUCKY PEAK RESERVOIR

Just minutes from Boise, Lucky Peak is a favorite for swimming, boating, jet skiing, and paddleboarding. Discovery Park and Sandy Point offer family friendly beaches, while Spring Shores Marina provides boat rentals and lake access. With wide open water and mountain views, it is the perfect spot for a full day on the lake.

QUINN'S POND AND WHITEWATER PARK

Near downtown, Quinn's Pond is ideal for paddleboarding, kayaking, and swimming. Next door, the Boise Whitewater Park features engineered waves that attract surfers and kayakers from across the region. Beginners and experts alike can enjoy a day on the water in a lively, central setting.

ROARING SPRINGS WATER PARK

Located in Meridian, Roaring Springs is one of the Northwest's largest water parks, offering slides, a lazy river, wave pools, and shaded cabanas. It is an all day adventure perfect for families, groups, and thrill seekers alike.

SUMMER PLAY ZONES

Local parks around the valley come alive in summer with splash pads that spray, mist, and bubble. They are simple, refreshing places to beat the heat and enjoy a break between adventures.

SWIMMING POOLS

The City of Boise operates several outdoor pools, including Ivywild Pool and the Natatorium Pool and Hydrotube, both popular for families and swim lessons. For year round access, visit the Boise City Aquatics Center or the Idaho Central Aquatic Center, which host classes, lap swimming, and recreation programs. Local YMCA facilities in Downtown Boise, South Meridian, and Caldwell also offer indoor pools, fitness programs, and youth swim options.

KEEP OUR RIVERS CLEAN

Glass containers are prohibited on the Boise River. Pack reusable bottles or plastic containers and help preserve this beautiful local waterway.

MORE PLACES TO SPLASH

Explore additional spots for cooling off, including Esther Simplot Park for paddleboarding and swimming, Black Canyon Reservoir near Emmett for boating and camping, and Robie Creek Park for tranquil shoreline views.

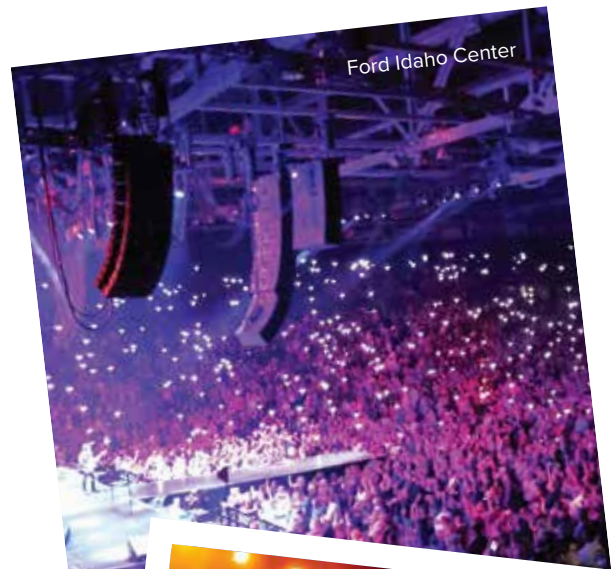

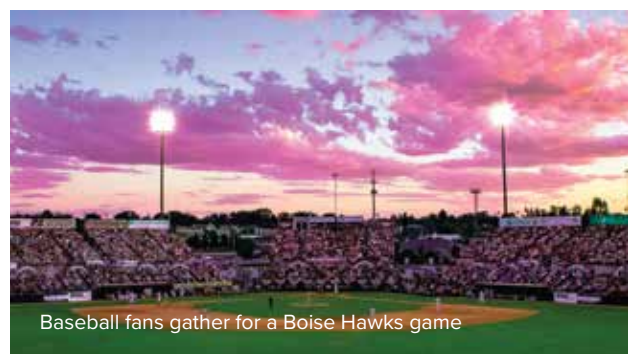

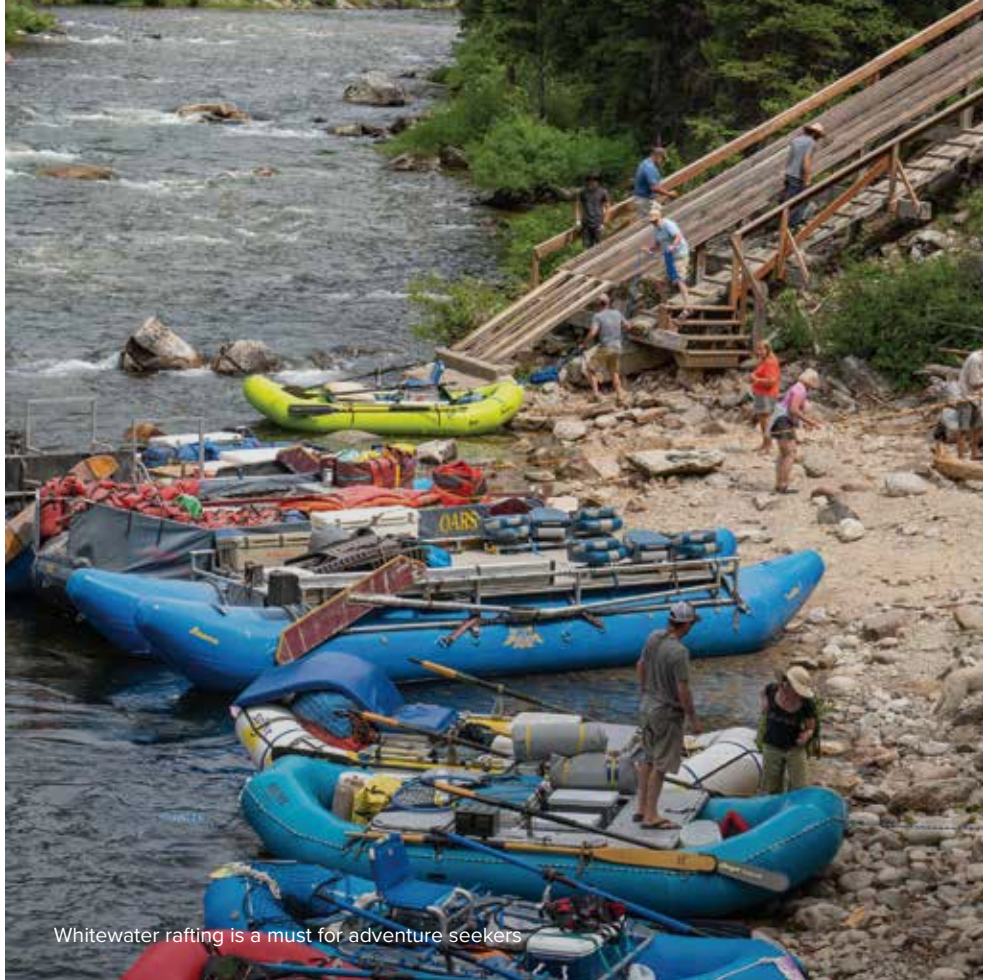

The City of Rocks National Reserve offers world class granite routes, while the Sawtooth Range pairs alpine beauty with technical challenge. Companies such as Cascade Raft and Kayak, Sawtooth Adventure Company, and Wilderness River Outfitters make it easy to experience Idaho's waters in unforgettable ways.

ICONIC SKI RESORTS

From the powder filled slopes of the Boise Mountains to the alpine charm of Sun Valley, these destinations invite both thrill seekers and families to make the most of every season. When the snow falls, skiers and snowboarders find pristine runs and stunning views. As the sun returns, the mountains come alive with hiking, mountain biking, concerts, and golf under open blue skies. From the first run of winter to a summer morning on the trail, Idaho's ski resorts capture the best of the state's outdoor spirit all year long.

BOGUS BASIN

Just 16 miles from Boise, Bogus Basin offers a beloved local escape for winter and summer fun. This nonprofit resort spans more than 2,600 acres of skiable terrain with night skiing, a tubing hill, and plenty of family friendly space for all skill levels. When the snow melts, the mountain transforms into a playground for hiking, mountain biking, concerts, and yoga with sweeping views of the Treasure Valley.

BRUNDAGE MOUNTAIN RESORT

Located 117 miles from Boise near McCall, Brundage Mountain is celebrated for its deep powder and diverse terrain across 1,500 acres. Visitors can enjoy well maintained runs, snowmobile tours, and backcountry access surrounded by panoramic mountain views. In summer, chairlifts carry hikers and bikers to mountain trails that wind through forested slopes.

SOLDIER MOUNTAIN

EXPLORE **OUR TRAILS**

There is no better way to experience Boise than on its trails. These winding paths reveal the heart of the Treasure Valley, where city views meet rolling foothills and quiet forests. Every turn offers a new perspective, from the Boise skyline to the scent of sage after rain and the sound of the river below. Whether you have an hour or a whole day, Boise's trails promise an easy escape into nature's rhythm.

CAMELS BACK HULLS GULCH LOOP

Explore this 3.9 mile loop trail near Boise, an inviting route that blends accessibility with scenic variety. With an elevation gain of 465 feet, it generally takes about one and a half to two hours to complete, making it perfect for a morning or evening outing. Popular with hikers, bikers, and birdwatchers, it offers peaceful moments during quieter times of day. Open year round, it showcases the changing colors of every season, offering an easy escape close to the city.

CAMELS BACK TRAIL LOOP

Enjoy this 1.7 mile loop within Hulls Gulch Reserve, a moderate hike that rewards you with sweeping views of Boise and the Treasure Valley. The route typically takes between thirty minutes and one hour, gaining 324 feet in elevation before reaching its scenic summit. Parking can be limited at the trailhead, but additional spaces are available nearby at Camels Back Park. It's a short, satisfying route that captures the essence of Boise's foothill beauty.

CERVIDAE PEAK

A local classic for seasoned hikers, this 4.5 mile out and back trail climbs steeply for 1,883 feet, offering a heart pounding workout and panoramic summit views. Expect the full trip to take around three and a half to four hours, depending on pace. Located about 17 miles from Boise, it begins past Spring Shores Marina before rising toward the ridge line. From the top, enjoy sweeping vistas of Shafer Butte, Thorn Creek Butte, and Pilot Peak, best explored from late spring through early fall.

FREDDY'S STACK ROCK TRAIL

This 11.6 mile loop near Boise is a favorite among hikers, birdwatchers, and horseback riders. Plan for about five to five and a half hours on the trail as it winds through wooded terrain and open ridgelines with 1,335 feet of elevation gain. The best months to visit are April through October, when wildflowers dot the slopes. Dogs are welcome but must remain leashed. Those who reach the summit are rewarded with an incredible view of the valley below.

HULLS GULCH INTERPRETIVE TRAIL

A 6.5 mile out and back hike that offers a moderate challenge and a rewarding glimpse into Boise's natural landscape. It usually takes three to three and a half hours to complete, with 1,138 feet of elevation gain along the way. The route winds past a seasonal creek, small waterfalls after rain, and stands of pine and wildflowers. The trail begins on a hillside before dipping into the gulch itself, where steep canyon walls rise dramatically on either side.

KEPROS MOUNTAIN TRAIL

This 9.4 mile route near Boise promises a vigorous climb and wide open views. Expect to spend about five to five and a half hours on the trail, gaining nearly 1,978 feet in elevation. It's a favorite among runners, hikers, and birdwatchers, especially between April and June when the conditions are ideal. Leashed dogs are welcome, and while the route is challenging, the panoramic rewards at the top make every step worthwhile.

POLECAT LOOP TRAIL

A local favorite year round, this 6.1 mile loop near Boise offers moderate terrain with an elevation gain of 748 feet. Most hikers complete it in about two and a half to three hours, enjoying rolling foothills and open landscapes filled with wild sage and grassland views. Ideal for hiking, biking, and horseback riding, it's a friendly, social trail where you'll likely meet fellow outdoor enthusiasts.

RED CLIFFS NATURE CENTER TRAIL

This 3.1 mile loop features a gentle climb of 482 feet and typically takes about one and a half to two hours to complete. Starting from the base of the Red Cliffs, the route ascends steadily before leveling out into a relaxed downhill return. With its balance of challenge and comfort, the trail makes an excellent choice for families or anyone seeking a shorter hike with plenty of scenic rewards.

TABLE ROCK TRAIL

A must do for locals and visitors alike, the Table Rock Trail spans 3.9 miles and climbs 882 feet to one of Boise's most iconic viewpoints. Plan for about two to two and a half hours to reach the summit and return. The route passes a historic quarry and leads to the striking cross monument overlooking the city skyline. The exposed terrain offers little shade, so early morning or cooler months are best for this rewarding climb.

THE BOISE RIVER GREENBELT

The Boise River Greenbelt is one of the Treasure Valley's most beloved features, stretching more than 25 miles and connecting parks, neighborhoods, and local destinations along the Boise River. This scenic pathway runs from Lucky Peak all the way to Eagle, creating a continuous green corridor through the heart of the city. It offers both residents and visitors a peaceful retreat where nature and community come together.

Lined with trees and wildlife, the Greenbelt weaves through Boise's most picturesque landscapes. Walkers, runners, and cyclists share its smooth pathways, while birdwatchers and anglers find quiet moments along the river's edge. It is more than a place for recreation; it is part of Boise's rhythm, where a simple stroll can turn into a full day of discovery.

ACCESSING THE GREENBELT

Access points are plentiful throughout Boise, Garden City, and Eagle, making it easy for everyone to enjoy this treasured space. Major entry points include Sandy Point Beach near Lucky Peak, Barber Park, Bown Crossing, Parkcenter Boulevard, Julia Davis Park, Ann Morrison Park, Veterans Memorial Park, Esther Simplot Park, and Quinn's Pond. Many areas provide parking, restrooms, and nearby amenities, allowing families and outdoor enthusiasts to explore comfortably at their own pace.

Camel's Back Park

Idaho's parks are the heart of its communities. Places where neighbors meet, families gather, and visitors discover the state's easy connection to the outdoors. This 28 acre riverside park offers shady picnic areas, playgrounds, bocce courts, and open lawns surrounded by mature trees.

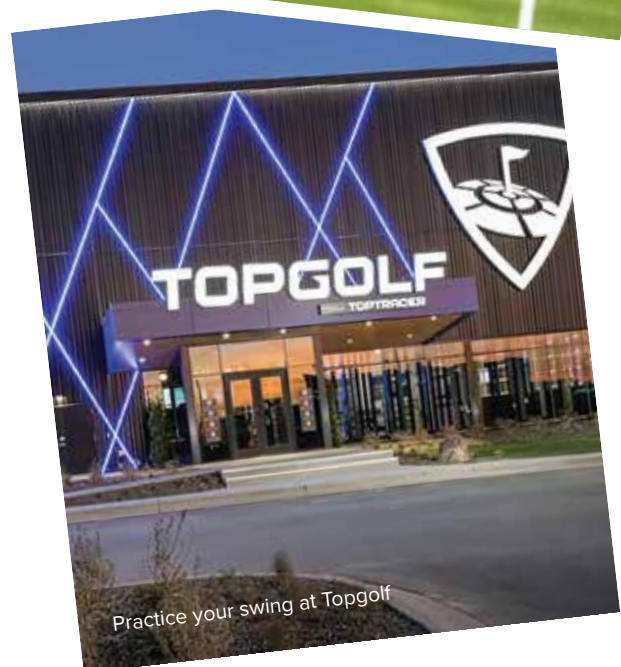
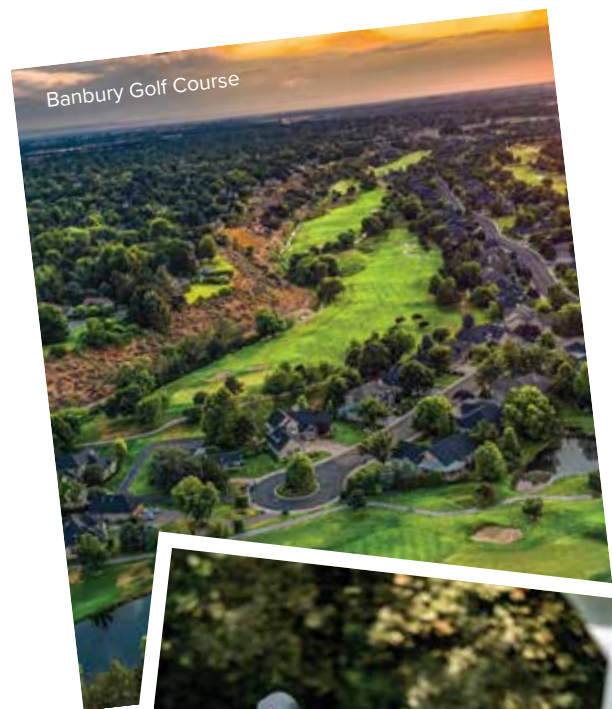

BURGDORF HOT SPRINGS

Nestled within the Payette National Forest, this historic retreat combines rustic charm with natural serenity. Guests can stay in log cabins and enjoy steaming pools surrounded by pine trees and mountain air. GOLD FORK HOT SPRINGS

Warm water, soft light, and scenic views make it an ideal place to unwind in every season.

KIRKHAM HOT SPRINGS

Found along Highway 21 near Lowman, about 1 hour and 45 minutes from Boise, this popular spot is known for its steaming pools and natural warm waterfall. Visitors can relax along the Payette River, explore nearby trails, or camp under the stars. The easy access and friendly atmosphere make it a must stop for locals and travelers alike.

MIRACLE HOT SPRINGS

Near Buhl, about 1 hour and 40 minutes from Boise, this tranquil destination offers a mix of private soaking pools and open communal baths. Guests can stay overnight in cozy cabins or camp under desert skies while enjoying the warm mineral water and peaceful surroundings. It's a rejuvenating escape with views of the Snake River Canyon just beyond.

PINE FLATS HOT SPRINGS

TIPS FOR VISITING IDAHO'S HOT SPRINGS

1. CHECK ROAD AND WEATHER CONDITIONS.

Many hot springs are in remote or mountainous areas where access can vary seasonally. Before you go, check Idaho Transportation Department updates or local ranger stations, especially in winter when snow can limit access.

2. GO EARLY OR MIDWEEK FOR A QUIETER SOAK.

Popular springs like Kirkham and Gold Fork can get busy on weekends and holidays. Visiting early in the day or during the week often means a more peaceful experience.

3. BRING WATER AND SNACKS BUT PACK THEM OUT.

There are often no trash services at natural sites, so practice "pack it in, pack it out." Keeping Idaho's landscapes pristine helps everyone enjoy them for years to come.

4. MIND THE TEMPERATURE.

Hot spring water can vary from comfortably warm to scalding. Test the water before entering, and avoid submerging your head in natural pools to stay safe and healthy.

5. RESPECT THE NATURAL SETTING.

Stick to existing trails, avoid soaps or shampoos in the water, and keep noise low to preserve the tranquil atmosphere.

6. LEAVE PETS OUT OF THE POOLS.

Dogs are welcome at many recreation areas but should never enter hot spring water. It can be harmful to them and affects the delicate mineral balance of the pools. Keep them leashed nearby and pack out any waste.

7. PLAN AHEAD FOR LIMITED FACILITIES.

Some sites, especially remote ones like Kirkham or Pine Flats, offer few amenities. Bring towels, sandals, and dry clothes for after your soak.

8. BE WILDLIFE AWARE.

Deer, elk, and other animals often share these areas. Observe from a distance and store food securely when camping nearby.

9. ENJOY THE SEASONS.

Hot springs are a year round delight. Snowy winter soaks feel magical, while spring and fall bring milder temperatures and colorful scenery. Just dress appropriately and check access conditions.

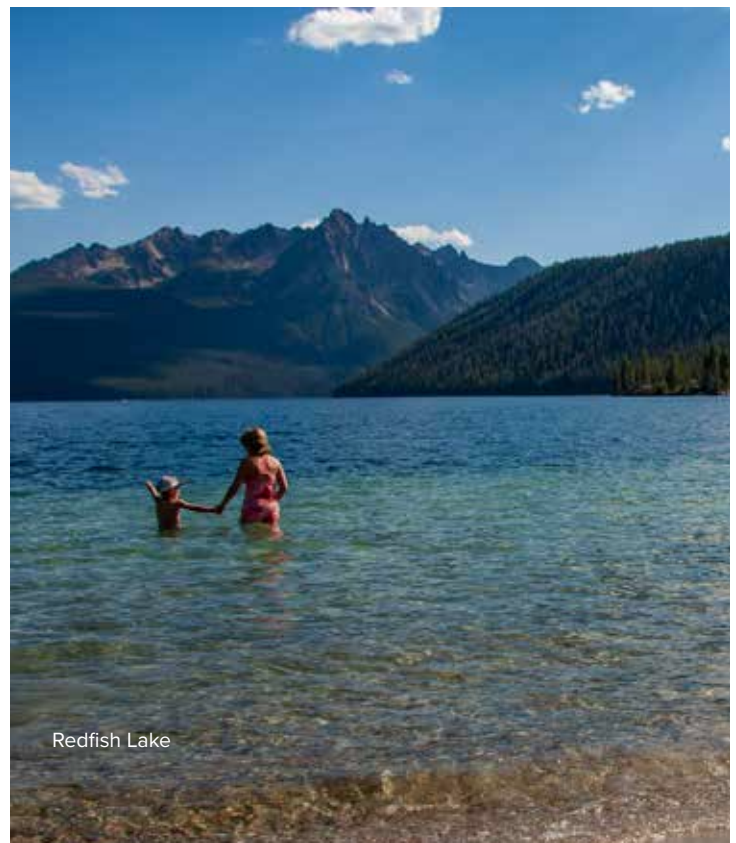
